		A) Many people in Texas supported slavery because they had migrated to Texas from other Northern states. B) Texas' close economic and social connections to the South led the state to vote to secede from the Union in 1861.

Third Significant Event(s)	The Civil War Across the United States

When:	What happened?	Significance:
		 A) 60,000 – 70,000 Texans fought in the war in places like Tennessee, Kentucky, and Georgia. B) Texas was far from most major battles, which allowed Texas to play a unique role in the war.

Fourth Significant Event(s) The Civil War in Texas

		A) Battles increased in Texas
		during the Civil War,
		especially between
		Unionists and
		Confederates.
		B) Very few battles took place
		in Texas, and Texans were
		able to successfully defend
		against Union attempts to
