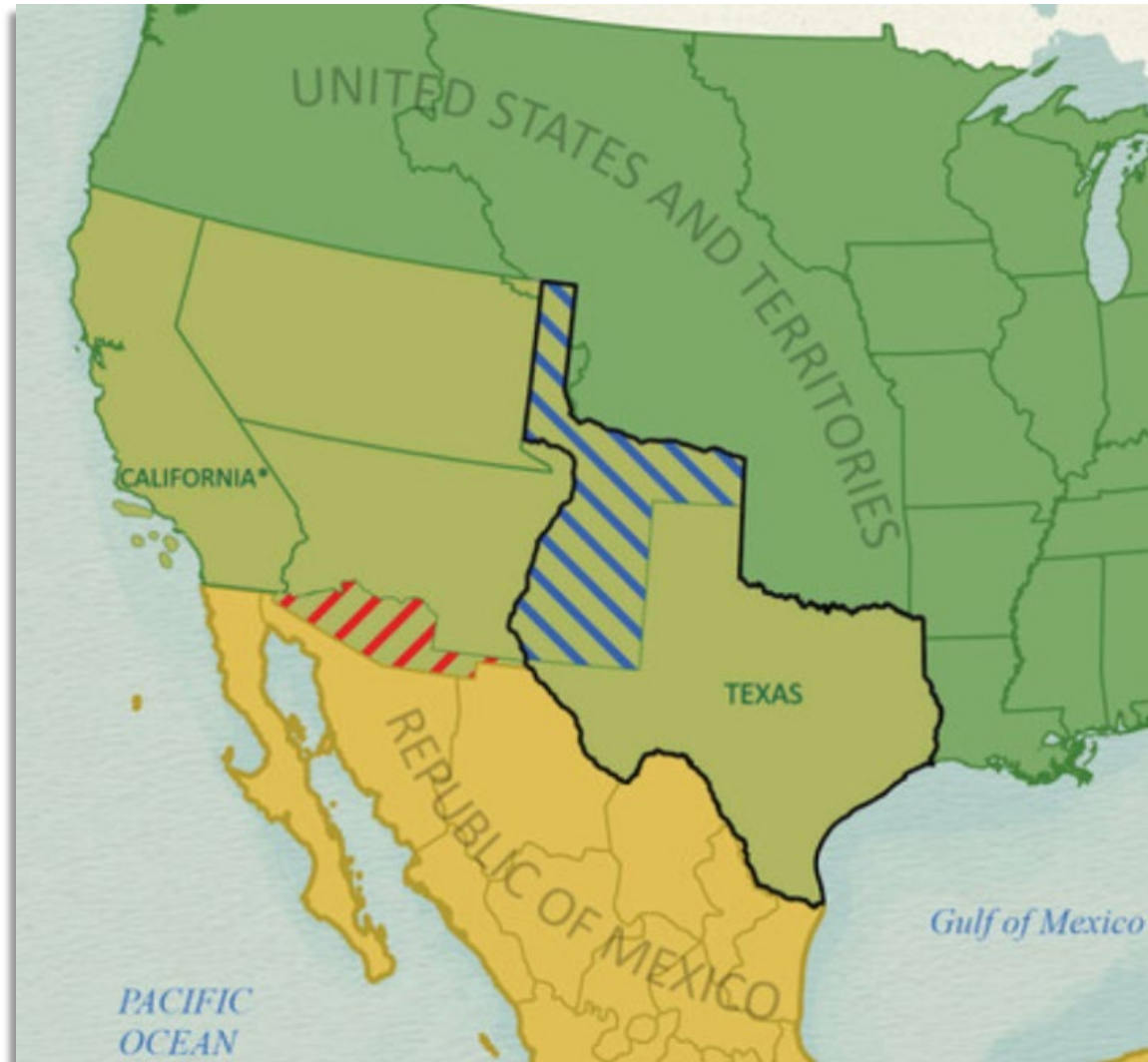

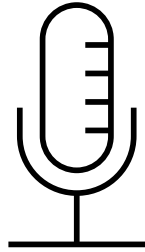
The first house built in Germania, Texas, 1895.

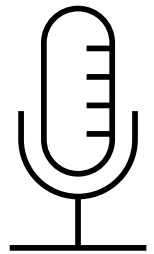

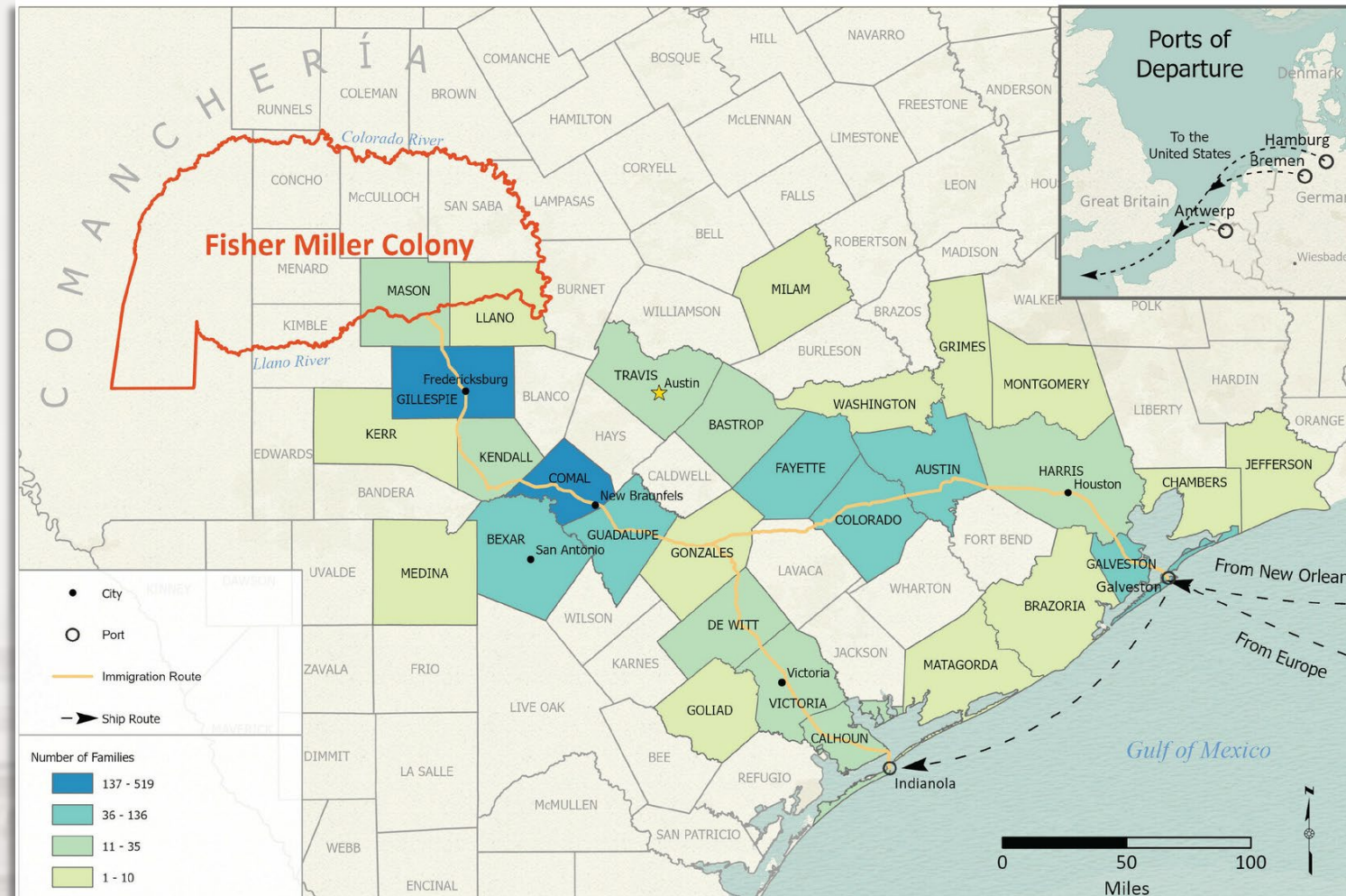
## STATE CENSUS OF 1847.

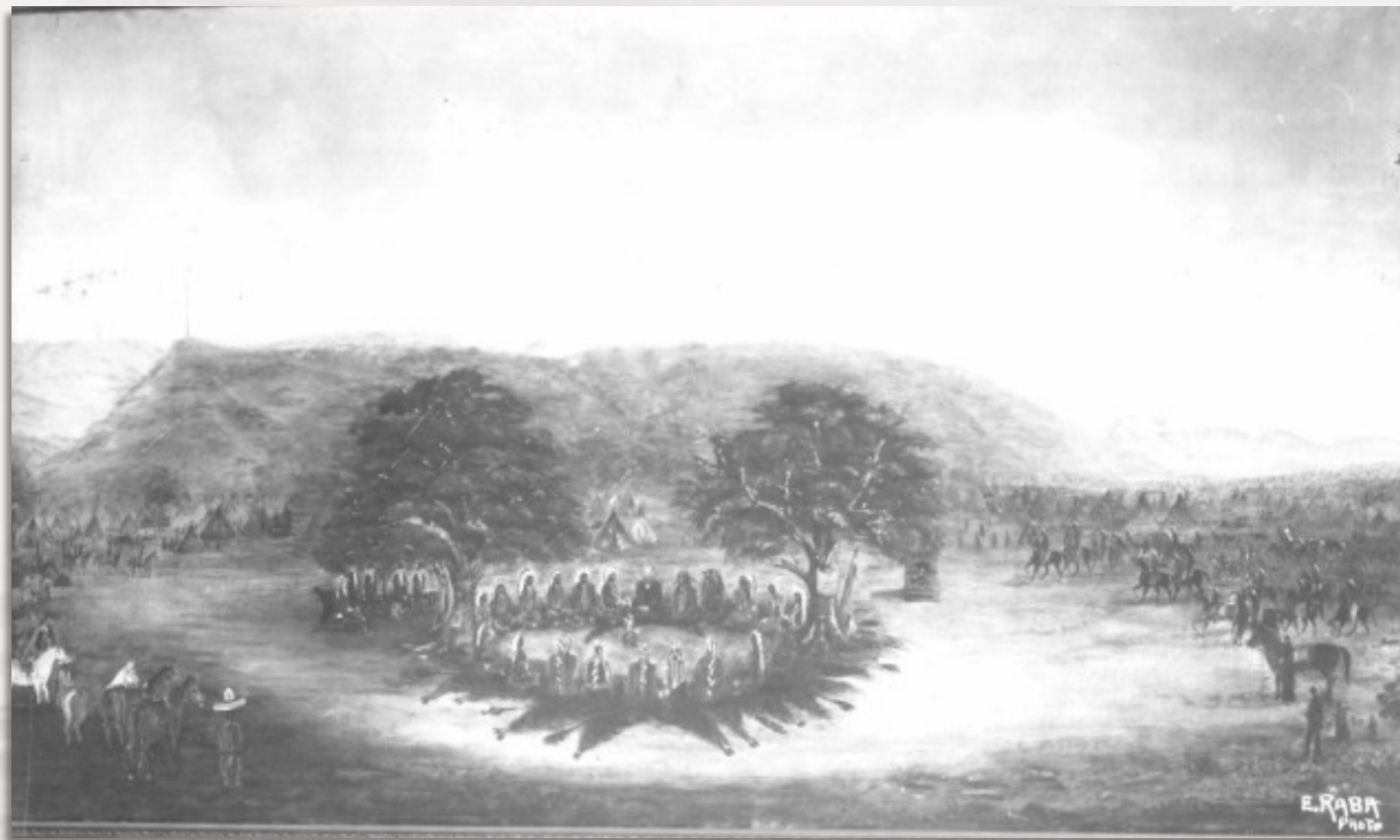

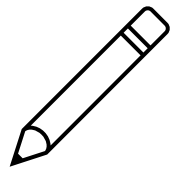
