

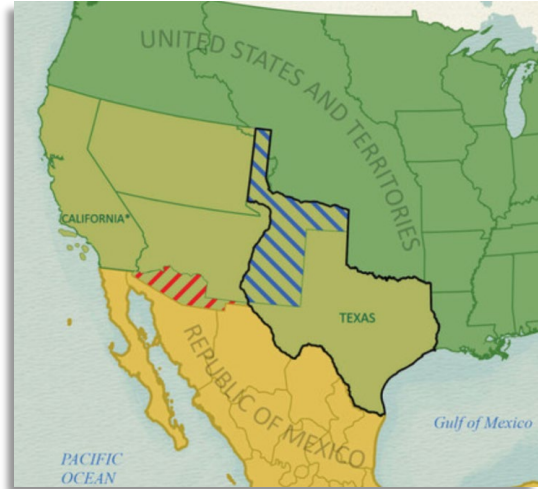

1. Texas experienced a number of significant developments during the Early Statehood era from 1845 to 1860. Which of the following statements below are true of Texas during this era? Place a checkmark next to all accurate statements.
 - Many Europeans immigrated to Texas during this era, especially Germans.
 - As sectional division between the Northern and Southern states in the U.S. intensified over slavery, many in Texas began to support the Northern anti-slavery states.
 - The non-Indian population of Texas increased from 125,000 in 1845 to over 600,000 in 1860.
 - Conflict between Texas Indians and Americans increased as many Americans migrated west into Texas Indian territory.
 - Many Texans worked to achieve the abolition of slavery within their state as a result opposition to slavery throughout the United States.
 - The western borders of Texas were reduced as part of the Compromise of 1850 to appease anti-slavery Northerners.
 - Most people moving into Texas during this era came from cotton-producing slave states in the American South.



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
