#### The Arrest of Stephen F. Austin, 1833



- What: Austin was arrested and imprisoned for encouraging Anglos in Texas to start making their own
   \_\_\_\_\_ after President Santa Anna had denied the request.
- Who: Stephen F. Austin, President Santa Anna
- Where: Arrested in Saltillo, Coahuila.
   Imprisoned in Mexico City for \_\_\_\_\_\_ years.
- Why is it Significant: Austin's time in prison caused him to be \_\_\_\_\_\_ supportive of the Mexican government.
