## **Requirements to Settle in Texas**

Requirements to Settle in Austin's Colony	<ul> <li>Become</li></ul>	
National Colonization Laws of 1823 & 1824	<ul> <li>have the power to control colonization.</li> <li>Set restrictions on the location and amount of land settlers could receive.</li> <li>Empresarios must learn</li> <li>The federal government has power to stop immigration for national security.</li> </ul>

## Slavery & the Empresario System

The State Constitution of Coahuila y Tejas, 1824, Article 13	<ul> <li>Article 13: Eliminates</li></ul>	Texas
"Decree No. 56," May 5, 1828	<ul> <li>"All contracts signed in foreign countries between emigrants and their laborers are valid in Texas."</li> <li>Tejanos and Anglos worked to get this law passed in the state government.</li> <li>Some Anglos in the U.S. createdyear contracts for the enslaved people. In this way, Anglos could legally bring enslaved people to Texas.</li> </ul>
