

Voices of Reconstruction: African American and Women's Perspectives Lesson Plan for 7th Grade Texas History (60-90 minutes)

The period of Reconstruction is often referred to as a "failure" in its attempts to reunify the nation and advance equality for the newly freed African Americans. All too often the positive impacts of individuals and organizations are overshadowed by the political turmoil of the time. This lesson will focus on the influences and contributions of women and African Americans during the Reconstruction era to shed light on some of the positive actions and progress during the era.

Lesson Topics

- Contributions of African American Legislators
- Role of Women during Reconstruction
- Education
- The Role of Churches

Essential Questions

- 1. In what ways can individuals or groups impact a society?
- 2. How did African Americans influence events and issues in Texas during the period of Reconstruction?
- 3. How did women influence events and issues in Texas during the period of Reconstruction?

Students will know the following information based on previous TEKS standards:

Identify the major eras in Texas history, describe their defining characteristics, and explain the purpose of dividing the past into eras, including Civil War and Reconstruction. Explain the political, economic, and social effects of Civil War and Reconstruction in Texas. Explain the significance of the following dates: 1876, adoption of current state constitution.

Students will develop the following skills during this unit based on the TEKS standards:

Analyze information by applying absolute and relative chronology, sequencing, categorizing, identifying cause-and-effect relationships, comparing, contrasting, finding the main idea, summarizing, making generalizations and predictions, and drawing inferences and conclusions. Use social studies terminology correctly.

Identify bias and points of view from the historical context surrounding an event that influenced the participants.
