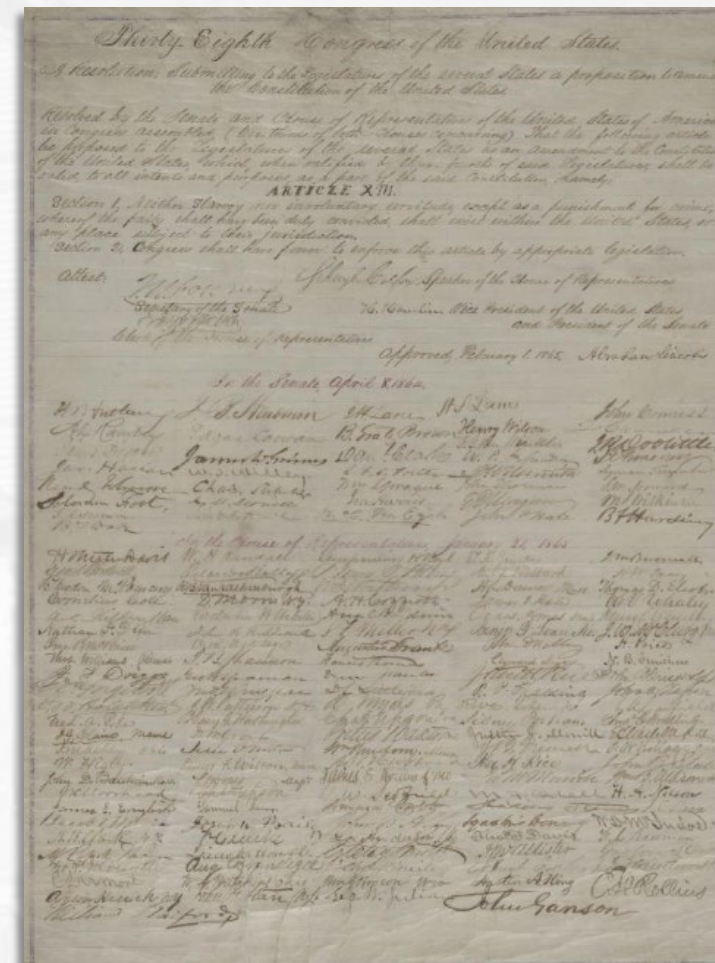

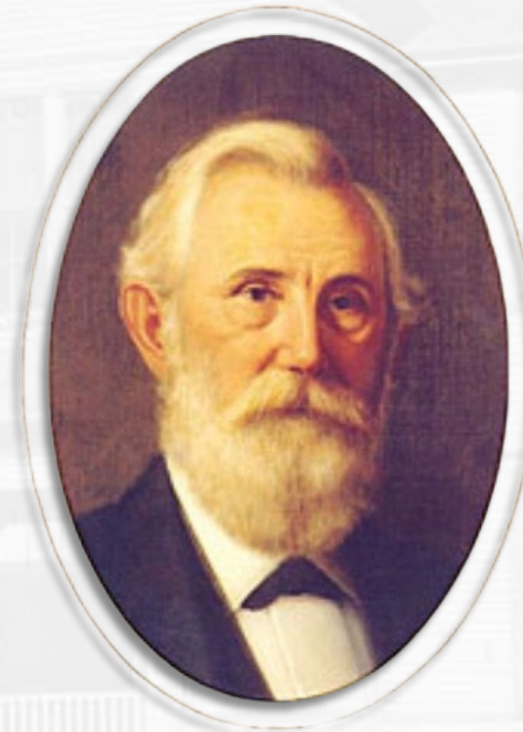

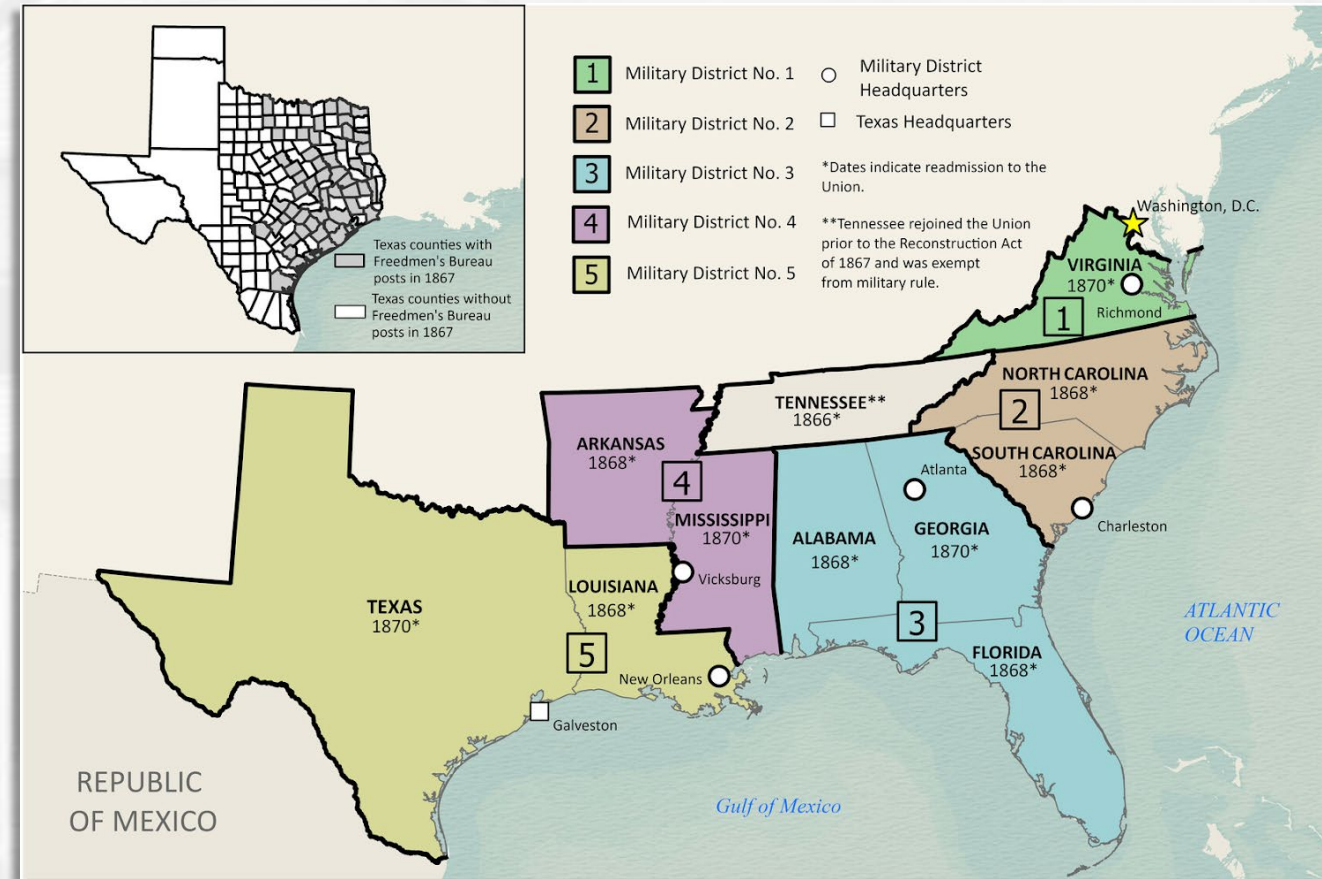

4) Congressional “Radical” Reconstruction 1868 - 1873

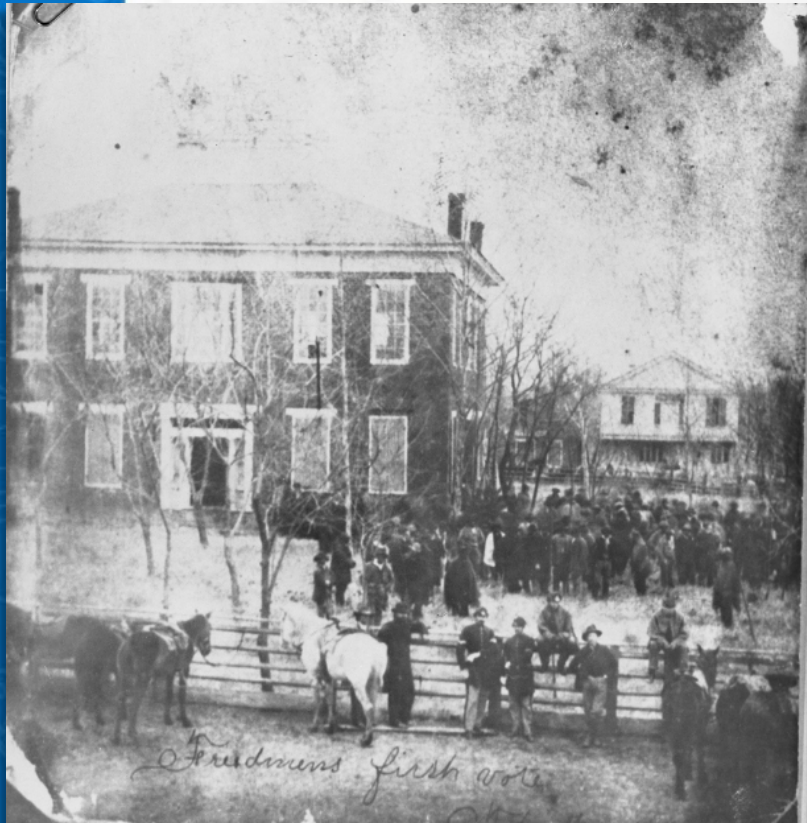
Stevens reported following from the Reconstruction Committee:

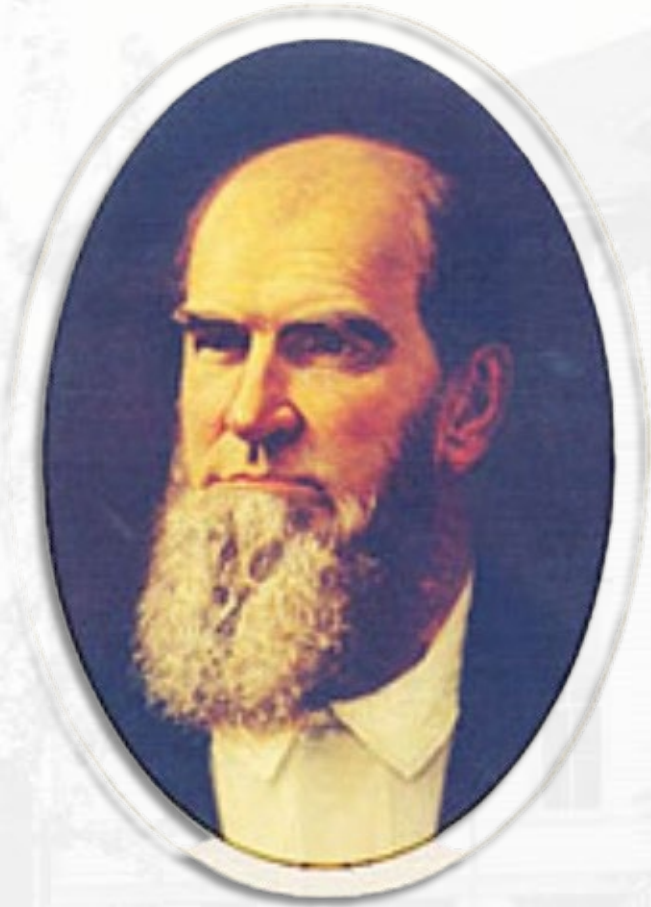

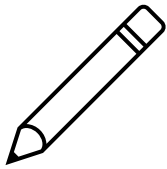

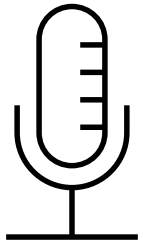
