


- 1. We will examine a timeline of the events of the Siege and Battle of the Alamo from the point of view of the people inside the Alamo.

Part I: The Timeline of the Alamo


The timeline of the events of the Alamo gives a day-by-day account of what the people inside the Alamo experienced, according to the historical record.




Option 1: Create a Storyboard
